



In addition to serving as a homeless shelter for children and families, Deep Roots strives to break the generational cycle of homelessness. Our program encourages children and their parents to envision a brighter future, to sustain healthy relationships, and to navigate a course towards personal and social responsibility. Through better life experiences, with mentors, and by providing healthy life-models, education, and supports, Deep Roots seeks to show our families that homelessness is not destiny. Ending poverty and homelessness begins with the building of community, relationships, and in genuine human meeting – beyond barriers of race, class, and religion. Community enriches all our lives, and the lives of our children; it lays the foundation for the gentle and peaceable world we long for: One in which the violence of poverty and homelessness have no more place...



Ending Family Homelessness– A Program Which Includes Housing





Deep Roots offers a residential program to end the cycle of homelessness in families. This includes transitional housing, meals, case management, and other related services including the support, friendship, and service of the on-site community. There are apartments and dorms for up to 12 families with children.




Homeless Prevention—Breaking the Cycle



The Deep Roots Children's Program is for children and their families who are currently homeless or who have experienced homelessness. It is a year-round program of specially designed monthly and weekly activities including after-school programming (called "Sprouts"), fieldtrips, fellowship, individual mentoring, and specialized assistance designed to empower families to break the cycle, moving beyond homelessness to a brighter future. This program also includes follow-up assistance and support for families who have experienced homelessness.

Our on-site soup kitchen, the Clairvaux Café, provides meals to all in need, volunteer opportunities to the community, and skill & resume building for our residents.

The Count Your Blessings Exchange (CYBE)



Deep Roots operates the "Count Your Blessings Exchange", providing free clothing, books, toys, and household items to our residents, as well as to the public. All items in the Exchange have been donated to Deep Roots.

The Exchange is typically open every Saturday from 9:30am-12:00pm.
